The three monologues that make up **Dressed as People** are:

Kelly Robson, "Skinless"

In 1989, while teaching Canadian Literature at a university in Edmonton, a nun reveals her past as a young instructor at a haunted school full of troubled children in 1950s Ireland.

Amal El-Mohtar, "The Shape of My Teeth"

In 1827, a woman reflects on her best friend's mysterious disappearance in Mortimer Forest on the Welsh border. She refuses to be left behind.

A.M. Dellamonica, "Repositioning"

In 2021, Alaska, a seasoned entertainer on the lesbian cruise circuit grapples with memories of an encounter with the unknown while on a repositioning cruise from Sydney, Australia to Vancouver, B.C. in 2018.

Kelly Robson

Kelly is a Nebula Award winning, and multiple Aurora awards winning science fiction, fantasy, and horror writer.

Author of: *Gods, Monsters, and the Lucky Peach* (Aurora), *Alias Space and Other Stories* (new release), and the short works *A Human Stain* (Nebula), *Waters of Versailles* (Aurora)

Amal El-Mohtar

Amal is an award-winning writer of fiction, poetry, and criticism. She's the science fiction and fantasy columnist for the New York Times Book Review. She has won the Hugo, Nebula, and Locus Awards.

Author of: Numerous short stories including **Seasons of Glass and Iron**, and co-author, with Max Gladstone, of **This Is How You Lose the Time War**.

A.M. Dellamonica

Dellamonica has been awarded the Sunburst Award for Canadian Literature of the Fantastic, and the Aurora Award for Best Novel. They teach Creative Writing at UCLA and at the University of Toronto Scarborough campus.

Author of: the Prix Aurora-winning *A Daughter of No Nation* and, as L.X. Beckett, the solarpunk thrillers *Gamechanger* and *Dealbreaker*, as well as over 50 short stories and poems

Mary Ellis

Mary has worked extensively as a director, actor and educator for many years. For Parry Riposte Productions, she directed the multi-award winning *The Elephant Girls*. She currently teaches at Carleton University in Ottawa and at St Lawrence College in Brockville, Ontario. She is also the Co-Artistic Director of Horseshoes and Hand Grenades Theatre Company.

Margo MacDonald

Margo is a five-time winner of the Prix Rideau Award for Outstanding Performance, as well as the Critics' Circle Award for Best Actress. In 2023, she was nominated for a Dora Award for her performance in *Dressed as People – a Triptych of Uncanny Abduction*. Margo's solo show, *The Elephant Girls*, has been touring to sold-out crowds ever since it premiered at the Ottawa Fringe Festival in 2015 – winning local, national, and international acclaim. To date, the show has won eleven awards. Margo's other recent performance credits include: *Bright Half Life* (Persephone Theatre) *The Persistent Stain* (undercurrents festival). *Heartlines* (TACTICS Mainstage & GCTC), *Albumen* (TACTICS Mainstage), *Goodnight Desdemona* (*Good Morning Juliet*), *Fly Me to the Moon, Pomme & 'Restes: Shipwrecked! on the Tempestuous Lost Island of Never*, and *A Mid-Winter's Dream Tale* (all with the Great Canadian Theatre Company); *Henry V*, and *Much Ado About Nothing* (A Company of Fools); and *The Penelopiad* (Citadel Theatre).
